(*1985) is a cellist in the field of Improvisation, New Music, Jazz and interdisciplinary projects. She lives in Cologne. From 2003 to 2008 she studied classical cello at the HfM Dresden and from 2008 to 2012 she studied Jazz at the University of Music and Dance Cologne.

Matthias Muche

The much-quoted "border areas" run like a thread through the activities of the Cologne-based trombonist Matthias Muche, who combines the pure sound possibilities of his instrument with extended playing techniques in his playing and creates a close connection to the aesthetics of Sound Art, New Music and Jazz. His work has so far focused on interdisciplinary projects in the field of music, dance and video art in which intermedia improvisations and compositional concepts and their feedback processes are explored.

Matthias Muche works as a freelance trombonist for Ensembles of 20th and 21st century music, as well as, as a composer, improviser and media artist. After studying music at the University of the Arts Amsterdam, Rotterdam and at the University of Music and Dance Cologne, he completed a postgraduate degree at the Academy of Media Arts Cologne and initiated the Frischzelle Festival for Intermedia Performance and Zeitkunst e.V.

Robert Landfermann

(*1982) is considered one of the best and most innovative European jazz bassists of his generation. The WDR- and SWR Jazz Prize winner and winner of the "New German Jazz Prize" played in various formations on all continents with world stars such as John Scofield, Lee Konitz, Yo-Yo Ma, Charlie Mariano, Joachim Kühn, Django Bates, Ralph Towner, Chris Potter, Tomasz Stanko and Barre Philips.

In the European scene he is known as an outstanding improviser, both in the traditional jazz environment as well as in the experimental avant-garde scene. He is the director of several of his own Ensembles and co-initiator of the Cologne artist collective KLAENG, which organizes Jazz festivals and workshops every year and launched the label Klaeng-Records in 2014.

His release "Night Will Fall" on the label Pirouet featured Jim Black on drums and was ranked among the best albums of 2016 by American "Downbeat" magazine. The second album of his quintet "Brief" was released in winter 2018.

Landfermann has been teaching at the Folkwang University of the Arts Essen since 2011. His work has been documented by publications on more than 70 recordings with renowned jazz labels and numerous radio recordings.

Etienne Nillesen

is a musician and composer from the Netherlands based in Cologne, Germany. The Snare Drum is the core of Nillesen's artistic practice. With an instrumental and physical approach, he explores and expands the boundaries of the natural acoustics of the snare drum with conventional playing techniques as well as extended techniques and preparations.

His work involves elements of conceptual and spontaneous composition, structured improvisation, performance, and sound art. Alongside his own work, Etienne is a performer of contemporary music and works with composition, movement and snare drum in a number of interdisciplinary projects.
