## Emiszatett exists since

2013 and was accepted into the funding program of the Ministry of Culture and Science for professional, free music ensembles in 2019. From afar you awell as the first name of its founder, the cellist Elisabeth Coudoux. Further, the Latin word "Emissarius", meaning "spie", is hidden within; spies master the art of hiding and they trust each other on their paths.

Emiszatett discovers and explores traditional and new ways of playing music. Everyone bears the same responsibility for the whole, which can constantly change its color, density and direction. Sufficient energy and time generates a multidimensional scope with a high depth of focus, transparency, concentration on the tonal, its components and nuances.

"The cello, usually rather known as a slightly melancholic romantic one, screams, trembles and jumps into time. Together with the piano as spaceship, the double bass as satellite, the trombone as nutrient and the snare drum as transducer, they disrupt the act of doing nothing. Sounds, which allow you to stroll within your self calmly rush past in order to later drop you off with an expanded perception. Destination Multiversum."
